WE NEED YOUR HELP

Grab & Go school program for 2024/25 school year

The Grab & Go School Food Program serves over 1200 students each month during the school year at 3 area schools falling within the Divine Mercy Parish community. Dartmouth South Academy and Ross Road are primary to junior high schools while South Woodside is a primary elementary school to grade 6. The food program augments the provincially supported breakfast program by providing additional nourishment to hungry students throughout the day.

We are given a tremendous opportunity to help in our small way alleviate the hunger that some of these children suffer daily. Recent statistics show that 1 in 3 children in Nova Scotia live in poverty with food insecurity as one of the three major challenges facing families. Dartmouth South Academy, a school of nearly 700 students, reported that the 1,700 dollars provided per month by the province was insufficient. As prices keep rising families are having difficulty covering everyday costs therefore this has placed a huge burden on schools to help with ensuring that students in this extraordinary time of need are provided for.

A special thank you to all members of the Divine Mercy Parish who gratefully provided food and or money during this past school year. Your generosity and kindness benefited many students who would have gone hungry without your support. Also thank you to the 4 members who help with the monthly school food deliveries.

It is our hope and prayer that you will continue to help us throughout this school year in supporting this most important outreach program which lessens the burden on families living with the worry and anxiety of feeding their children. Every child deserves access to healthy food, so that they can reach their full potential both inside and outside the classroom.
